An individual must meet the following qualifications as provided in 3GCA §3101 to be a registered voter on Guam:

- ✓ Must be a citizen of the United States
- ✓ Must be a resident of Guam
- ✓ Must be 18 years of age by the day set for an election
- ✓ Must not be committed under a sentence of imprisonment
- ✓ Must not be confined to a mental institution
- ✓ Must not be judicially declared insane

Who We Are

The GEC is an autonomous and independent commission of the Government of Guam. The Commission is made up of seven members, all of whom are registered voters of Guam. I Maga'låhen Guåhan (Governor of Guam) appoints six members, three from each political party through recommendations made by the Democrat and Republican parties. The seventh member, who is independent is selected and appointed by the six members. Members serve a two-year term. Executive Director Maria I.D. Pangelinan, who serves at the pleasure of the Commission, manages the Guam Election Commission's administrative team.

GEC has solved election-day overcrowding issues by increasing the number of precincts. As a result of the 9 new precincts, GEC employed 45 more precinct officials for the 2016 elections.

GEC has implemented an online voter registration in 2016 for the convenience of the citizens. Over 200 citizens have utilized this form of registration.

The 4,198 increase in Registered Native Inhabitants is attributed to the support of the Governor's Office, which proclaimed May 2016 as Decolonization Registry Month.



REASONS FOR SIGNIFICANT CHANGES

\$1,312,559

- The increase in appropriation and expenditures in fiscal year 2016 were to fund the 2016 Primary Election and make payments on prior year obligations. GEC received a supplemental appropriation of approximately \$605K of which \$427K was expended and obligated for contracts, supplies, equipment, and miscellaneous.
- The increase in salary expenditures was mainly due to the increase in personnel from 14 to 17 in fiscal year 2016.
- The increase in supplies expenditures was due to the purchase of the ballot-stock for the 2016 election.

Total Expenditures

- The increase in equipment expenditures was due to the purchases of 70 voting booths for \$70K.
- There were no expenditures for Sub-Recipient/Grant and Capital in fiscal year 2016.

Looking Forward

In anticipation of future elections, the GEC continues to strive in:

- Preparing the upcoming 2016 General Election, ensuring that elections are conducted in a fair, efficient, and effective manner.
- Continuing efforts to register Native Inhabitants for the Guam Decolonization Registry.

Challenges

The GEC confronts issues and barriers with:

- Populating the Decolonization Registry.
- Increasing the number of registered voters and voter participation.
- Validating the voter registry.
- Addressing administrative complaints and problems.
- Addressing issue on one tabulation machine that was inoperable.
- Hiring 335 precinct officials; 22 poll maintenance workers; 14 telephone operators; and 29 tabulators.
- Opening 9 additional precincts.
